About the Community Working Group

Thank you for your interest in joining the Tonstad DataPark Community Working Group.

The Community Working Group has been established to create an open and ongoing dialogue between GreenScale and the local community throughout the development of Tonstad DataPark.

The group will provide a structured forum where community representatives can receive project updates, ask questions, share perspectives, and provide feedback directly to the project team.

Our objective is to ensure that local knowledge, concerns, and ideas are heard and considered as the project develops.

Participation in the Community Working Group is **voluntary**, and **members are free to withdraw at any time**.

The Community Working Group aims to:

- Build an open and transparent relationship between GreenScale and the local community.
- Gather local perspectives that can help inform project planning and engagement activities.
- Identify community priorities, opportunities, and concerns throughout the project's development.

How the group will work

The Community Working Group will meet approximately once per month.

Meetings will be led by GreenScale's Managing Director for Norway, **Nenad Keseric**, together with members of the wider team where appropriate.

Meetings will typically include:

- Updates on the latest project developments
- Information on upcoming milestones and activities
- Open discussion and Q&A



- Feedback sessions on topics where community input can help shape project approaches
- Time for participants to raise issues or suggestions

Meetings are expected to begin following the summer holiday period, with the first meeting planned for late August or September 2026.

Who will participate

We are bringing together a small group of approximately 5 to 10 representatives from across the local community, including:

- Local residents
- Cabin owners
- Local businesses
- Students
- Other community stakeholders

Our goal is to create a group that reflects a broad range of local perspectives and experiences.

To ensure the group remains productive and allows for meaningful discussion, membership will be limited. If we receive more expressions of interest than available places, GreenScale will seek to establish a group that reflects a balanced cross-section of the local community and its stakeholders.

What influence will participants have?

The Community Working Group is an advisory forum.

While it is not a formal decision-making body, participant feedback will play an important role in helping GreenScale understand community priorities and improve how the project is developed and communicated.

Feedback from the group may help to:

- Improve community engagement and communication.
- Inform project planning where community input is relevant.
- Highlight local opportunities and potential concerns at an early stage.
- Shape topics for future engagement and information sharing.

Where suggestions cannot be incorporated, GreenScale will seek to explain the reasons openly and transparently.

The aim is for participants to see how their input has been considered throughout the process.



Our commitment

GreenScale is committed to creating a constructive, respectful and transparent forum for dialogue.

We recognise that participants may hold different views about the project. The Community Working Group is intended to provide a space where those views can be shared openly and respectfully.

By working together, we hope to build understanding, improve communication, and ensure local perspectives remain an important part of the project's development.
